Creative Youth Nurture Fund



The Creative Youth Nurture Fund to support organisations that can reach specific groups of young people that are seldom heard. This relates to children and young people that are: Living with physical or intellectual disabilities, Refugees and asylum-seekers, Living with mental health issues, LGBTI+; Traveller and Roma, etc.

This €500,000 fund will support 8-10 youth-led initiatives over a period of 18-24 months and will empower children and young people between the ages of 6-24 to nurture their creative passions and ignite their creative potential.

The Ireland Against Racism funding call



€1 million is being made available to applicant groups operating at national, regional and local level to support the implementation of the National Action Plan Against Racism. The overall objective of this fund is to provide funding for national and regional projects, as well as local initiatives, that aim to combat racism and foster racial equality and community cohesion. The grant scheme is open to applications from existing non-government organisations and community organisations that have a specific focus on anti-racism initiatives

MNÁ NA HÉIREANN, WOMEN OF IRELAND EMPOWERMENT FUND 2023 – 2026



The Fund's goal is to promote access to employment and/or education programmes for 850+ migrant women OR women experiencing socio-economic disadvantage in Ireland. Furthermore, the Fund aims to empower 260+ of these women into employment.

The Fund offers a package of cash grants and non-financial supports to the value of €175,500 for up to 4 to 5 projects, to help them expand and increase their social impact.
