VISION FOR COMMUNITY WELLBEING





This Wellbeing Vision is based on the data gathered during an in-person consultation held at North Kildare Sports Centre with attendees from the Clane/Maynooth Municipal District. The Vision is structured around six key themes: Health (Physical and Mental), Environment and Sustainability, Values, Culture and Meaning, Economy and Resources, Social and Community Development, and Participation, Democracy and Good Governance. The data was supplemented with additional information gathered from an online consultation. This Vision is a highlevel view of the key themes that emerged and detailed data can be accessed on the Kildare PPN website.



HEALTH (PHYSICAL AND MENTAL)

Asset Mapping (What we have):

- Equestrian centres, castles, and golf courses provide recreational opportunities.
- Town parks, forests, and walks contribute to physical and mental well-being.
- Accessible healthcare facilities such as primary care centres and nursing homes.
- Mental health support services like mindfulness and counselling are available.
- Sports clubs like GAA and Maynooth Town FC promote physical activity.

Vision for the future (What we would like):

- Develop more exercise facilities with accessible equipment and covered outdoor spaces.
- Improve mental health services, including more psychologists and early intervention systems.
- Enhance accessibility for people with disabilities, such as wheelchair swings and footpaths.
- Foster inclusivity by promoting cultural competences in the health system and community spaces.
- Encourage more physical fitness activities for all ages, including older people and carers.



ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

Asset Mapping (What we have):

- Community gardens, wildflower areas, and allotments support sustainability.
- Cultural buildings and heritage sites preserve the community's history and identity.
- Canals and greenways offer recreational opportunities and scenic walks.
- Recycling facilities and smoke-free zones promote a healthier environment.
- Bogs and forests provide natural resources and contribute to biodiversity.

Vision for the future (What we would like):

- Implement better recycling services and facilities for various materials, including glass and batteries.
- Preserve peat bogs and educate the public on the importance of environmental protection.
- Promote environmental science-based actions and educational programs in schools.
- Improve transportation by creating connected footpaths, cycle lanes, and reducing heavy traffic in towns.
- Encourage pond projects and biodiversity awareness in towns and villages.





VALUES, CULTURE AND MEANING

Asset Mapping (What we have):

- Community halls, cultural groups, theatres, and sports clubs foster a sense of belonging.
- Churches, mosques, and places of worship play a vital role in community life.
- Events such as St. Patrick's Day Parade and Roma Pride Week celebrate diversity.
- Music and drama groups provide opportunities for artistic expression.
- Educational institutions like Maynooth University contribute to cultural and intellectual growth.

Vision for the future (What we would like):

- Create an inclusive community that respects and celebrates cultural diversity.
- Develop local spaces for young people to seek support and express themselves.
- Promote intergenerational projects, crafts, storytelling, and cultural events.
- Support local artisans, farmers' markets, and businesses to preserve the community's identity.
- Offer language classes and facilities for cultural exchange and integration.

- Political clinics, internet access, and social media platforms facilitate communication with decision-makers.

- Tidy Towns and environmental groups contribute to local governance.
- Places of worship and cultural spaces foster community connections.
