





Funding Opportunities



Community Climate Action Fund

Kildare County Council is very excited to open the Community Climate Action Programme fund in December 2023. This grant programme will support Kildare communities to build low carbon communities and engage in climate action projects.

This funding will be available to support and engage community groups to develop projects that tackle climate action, sustainability and biodiversity.

There will be 3 tiers of the funding available.
Co. Kildare has been allocated €897,000 for projects that range from small, medium and large scale.

- 10% of the funding is available for small projects between €2,000 and €20,000.
- 40% of the funding is available for medium scale projects between €21,000 and €50,000.
- 50% of the funding is available for large projects between €51,000 and €100,000.

Once the fund opens applicants will have 12 weeks to get their applications submitted.

Examples of some potential projects include:

- Community gardens
- Dispersed Orchards
- Pocket Forests
- Encouraging Active Travel
- Food Waste Projects
- · Retrofitting Community Buildings
- Rewilding & Biodiversity projects
- · Repair cafes & swap shops

Waterways Ireland Community Grant Scheme

Waterways Ireland is delighted to announce the launch of its 2024 Heritage and Biodiversity in the Community Grants Scheme in support of the Waterways Ireland Heritage and Biodiversity Plan.

A fund of €20,000 has been allocated to assist community based heritage and biodiversity projects which compliment or fulfil the delivery of the Waterways Ireland Heritage and Biodiversity Plan along the Barrow Navigation, Grand Canal and Royal Canal. Applications will be considered from communities, individuals and organisations seeking assistance for projects related to inland waterways' heritage and biodiversity. This can include data collection & research, good heritage practice in managing sites, collections, objects, etc. and support fresh approaches and initiatives that promote active engagement with heritage and biodiversity.
